

Title VI of the Civil Rights Act

Advance Transit Inc. hereby gives public notice of its policy to uphold and assure full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, and all related statutes. Title VI and related statutes prohibiting discrimination in Federally assisted programs require that no person in the United States of America shall on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, sex, age, or disability be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal assistance.

Any person who believes they have been aggrieved by an unlawful discretionary practice regarding Advance Transit's programs has the right to file a formal complaint. Any such complaint must be in writing and submitted to Advance Transit Title VI Coordinator within sixty (60) days following the date of the alleged occurrence. In Vermont, Advance Transit will share information with the Vermont Agency of Transportation, Office of Civil Rights or you may contact them by calling 802-828-6651 and stating that you would like to make a Title VI complaint. In New Hampshire, Advance Transit will share information with the New Hampshire Department of Transportation, Office of Civil Rights or you may contact them by calling 603-271-6612 and stating that you would like to make a Title VI complaint. If you would like more information about your Title VI rights, you may call the New Hampshire Department of Transportation, Office of Civil Rights and request it be provided to you.
